Member Criteria

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS CRITERIA:

As defined in the bylaws, Associate members shall be individuals or firms representing trades or suppliers serving the automotive service and/or repair industry.

MEMBERS AT LARGE CRITERIA:

As defined in the bylaws, members at large shall be individuals or firms that: (i) are engaged in the automotive service and/or repair business; (ii) are located in a state that does not have an Affiliate Member; and (iii) decide not to join an Affiliate Member in a neighboring state. A Member at Large may not continue as such if an Affiliate Member is established in the state in which such Member at Large has its principal place of business.

AFFILIATE MEMBERS CRITERIA:

Any organization requesting Affiliate Member status with AASP must provide the following materials and documentation prior to Board of Director consideration:

- Provide the AASP with a formal letter requesting admission as an Affiliate Member with the signatures of the President and Secretary of the organization.
 - The letter must be accompanied separately with the following information/materials:
 - Current formal name of the organization
 - Year organization started
 - Geographical area served (State(s) served)
 - Bylaws (or similar governing document/guidelines)
 - Articles of Incorporation (or State incorporation papers)
 - Federal identification number (as applicable)
 - Mission statement (or goals and purpose of organization as approved by the Board)
 - Most recent monthly financial statement
 - Most recent fiscal year end financial statement
 - Most recent number current members, by category (as applicable)
 - Most recent list of current Board of Directors
 - Types of membership categories with definitions and membership fees assessed for each category
 - Copy of all current publications including, but not limited to, membership brochure, newsletters, product & services brochures, etc.
- Must sign and adhere to the Affiliate Member Agreement as currently approved by the AASP Board of Directors.

The AASP Board of Directors will review the information and materials provided and approve or deny request for admission based on the powers provided for in the AASP bylaws.

At the discretion of the AASP Board of Directors and, in accordance with the powers provided in the AASP bylaws (Article IV; Section 1), any organization applying for AASP Affiliate Member status which is an existing Affiliate (or comparable) Member of another organization that provides competitive products and/or services, can be denied membership in the Association.
